This October, St Louis Estate will raise funds for the National Breast Cancer Foundation (NBCF). As part of our fundraising efforts we are hosting our first ever Pink Ribbon Brunch, this event will support NBCF's goal to work towards zero deaths from breast cancer by 2030.

Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia. A staggering 1 in 7 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime. This equates to 55 Australians facing a diagnosis each and every day. This year, more than 3,000 women and men will lose their lives to breast cancer. And without research, a further 27,000 more lives will be lost to breast cancer by 2030. In the 27 years since NBCF's inception, the five-year survival rate for breast cancer has increased from 76% to 91%. Ultimately, NBCF is working towards a goal of zero deaths from breast cancer by 2030.




