# COVID MANDATORY CONTACT REGISTER

We are seeing a range of strategies being introduced to reduce the spread and limit the impact of COVID on the lives of all Australians. Each state has it's own requirements specific to its needs, and the use of technology to support contact tracing efforts is now being used here in WA to assist us should there be an outbreak of community transition.

Since the re-introduction of the contact tracing and the new SafeWA app, there have been several questions raised about why we've elected to use digital registers in our setting.

- Electronic check-in methods (such as QR codes) and digitised contact tracing records will speed up investigations should an outbreak occur.
- Hand-written details can be difficult to read and need to be turned into an electronic format for contact tracing. This is time consuming on village resources.
- Electronic methods are also contactless and reduce physical contact between people.

You will see the QR Code for St Louis Estate displayed in all communal areas of the Estate.

It is a mandatory government requirement that every time someone enters a communal area, they sign in using either the SafeWA app or the manual register. This applies to all residents, visitors, staff & contractors. These records will be kept for 28 days and then destroyed, as per WA Government requirements.

If you have a mobile device and would like some assistance in registering for the SafeWA app and using the QR codes, please don't hesitate to ask for some assistance at reception. We would be more then willing to assist where possible.

These systems are designed to keep everyone in the community safe.

# Tips for Bin Usage at St Louis

Heading into 2021, let's double check our rubbish before we put it in the wrong bin. There has been several reports of residents not using the general rubbish, garden organics & recycling bins correctly. Follow the below tips to ensure correct bin usage.

- General Rubbish goes in the **Red Lid Bins** Ensure your wrap any rubbish with offensive odours before putting them in the bin.
- Recycling goes in the Yellow Lid Bins Only items which can be recycled are to be put in the yellow bins, unfortunately when used for general rubbish, the bins will not be emptied by the Town of Claremont.
- Garden Organics goes in the **Green Lid Bins** There are a limited number of these bins available and they must only be used for garden waste.

The Green Lid and Yellow Lid bins are for shared communal use, so think of others before filling them up. In addition, please remember bins must be left in the designated bin area, or immediately returned to the area after use. This allows for efficient collection of bins on Wednesday mornings and ensures no bins are missed out.


