### MAGNIFICENT MONT CLARE - SET TO OPEN

The state-of-the-art Mont Clare Residential Care Facility being launched by Continuing Health Care (CHC) is nearing completion. It will provide high-quality care and service to St Louis Estate residents and the local and wider community.

CHC are working with Badge Constructions on finishing touches to the building. Subject to the final processes of Federal Government certification, an opening is scheduled for late March 2012.

The first occupants of this exceptional facility will be the 29 residents of Melvista Care Facility, and their carers and administrative staff who have worked together for up to a decade. This continuity of care will make the move from Melvista as seamless as possible, and will give reassurance and peace of mind to residents and their families.

Mont Clare will set a new benchmark nationally for aged-care accommodation. The unique layout, with no corridors, caters for 'Low Care Assisted Living' with 24-hour on-site care - and 'High Care', where residents with greater needs can take advantage of the higher degree of nursing care and services that are available in the facility.

All 73 rooms have ensuite facilities and most have generous balconies

with views, giving residents and their visiting families the chance to be outside together. There is also the capacity for adjoining rooms, if couples would like greater companionship.

### Live the life you want to live

The essence of CHC's beliefs is that residents and their families should be involved in decisions on how they live their lives and receive care. Too often, sole emphasis is given to clinical needs, but CHC takes a holistic approach to fostering resident and family social interaction, empowerment and spontaneity, while still providing first-class nursing care.

Mont Clare will be leading the way as a world-class residential aged care facility. With almost half the rooms already set aside for occupation by Melvista residents, some discussion and forward-planning is going to be necessary amongst families seeking accommodation in the new facility. Keeping fit and stretching his body are challenges that drive St Louis Estate resident, Rev. George Powell.

A former marathon and half-marathon runner, George has 'passed the baton' to his son and grandson. He has also completed an arduous 22-day trek in the Himalayas, climbing to 5,545 metres, and physical activity continues to be a large part of his everyday life - for his 80th birthday last May, he cycled 80 kilometres!

George and his wife, Gladys, live in a light-filled unit that has a garden and a balcony with River glimpses, and they are active participants in St Louis events. He leads a fellowship group and conducts a monthly service in the Kingsmill Lounge, and stands-in when other churches need a locum minister. George is also very involved in making contributions to the Estate's community, having recently been appointed Chair of the Residents' Committee.

Gladys swims regularly in the indoor pool, which is heated to a constant 27°C, and where a physiotherapist conducts weekly aqua therapy sessions. She also volunteers in the Library that contains DVDs and books, which particularly came into its own for residents since the Claremont fire, when the Town's library was lost.

November 2011 saw the 50th anniversary of George's ordination, and his memoirs are soon to be published. No doubt, Gladys will ensure that a copy is available in the St Louis Library!

## A NEW HOME IN FAMILIAR SURROUNDINGS

John Moody AM, retired Headmaster of Guildford Grammar School (GGS), and his wife, Janet, are recently-arrived residents at St Louis Estate.

They left their Shenton Park townhouse for single-storey living and are enjoying their new surroundings that still give them a lovely garden and keep them in a familiar suburb.

"I had a second cousin who lived here, and she gave us a very good feeling about the quality of care and operating style," John said. "We like it that we're not flanked on all sides and we've been busy planting natives in our garden. We also like the fact that maintenance and garden help are available, if we need it," he added.

John was awarded the Member of the Order of Australia medal for Services to Education in 1996, and myriad achievements underscore his sterling leadership at GGS between 1979 and 1996. However, he is especially proud of the scholarships for Indigenous students that he established in 1990.

"GGS had a number of Aboriginal students from 1910, but no continuity. I went to the School Council who agreed the School would remit one-third of the boarding and student fees; ABStudy provided the other third, and I approached BHP (in the Pilbara), Argyle Diamonds (in the Kimberley) and Western Mining (in Kalgoorlie) for the final third. We started with one youngster from each region, which has increased to about 25 students at the School currently, and over 140 through the years. We were like a lighthouse for Indigenous scholarships, and now all the major independent schools are involved."

There's no time to put his feet up! A parishioner at St George's Cathedral, John has been Chairing the Taskforce for the Cathedral's restoration program for the past 10 years, which is now at Stage 3 of five stages. "Maintaining the momentum is very demanding and we meet fortnightly, at the very least. As Headmaster, I had to consistently make decisions on things I knew nothing about – like organs and stained glass windows – and that pattern is continuing," smiled John!
