DEAN STREET DEVELOPMENT

The construction of the new Dean Street Apartments, Residents' club and Wellness centre continues apace. The ground floor slab has been completed with works underway for the level 1 formwork. Pre-cast concrete walls are methodically being installed by the crane, after some minor delays in productions due to the pre-cast concrete factory being surrounded by the recent bushfires! We are set to see the building really start to take shape over the next few months, with the restoration of the Heritage Building due to commence imminently.

Sadly, I missed our February Celebrate St Louis morning tea, but I enjoyed a lovely home made birthday cake with my family instead.

February brought with it a little COVID-19 hiccup, as we were snapped into a short period of lockdown and the introduction of mandatory mask wearing. I'd like to thank all our St Louis Estate Residents and Staff for your swift uptake and cooperation with the temporary restrictions and changes to services that occurred during our two-week period of restrictions. It was pleasing to see how well the emergency response procedures we have developed and implemented for COVID-19 were actioned and worked well.

The WA COVID-19 vaccination program commenced with Phase 1a on 22 February. The vaccines are being rolled out over the course of 2021 as the vaccine has been proven safe and effective by the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA). The vaccine program is being implemented in a phased approach because there is currently a limited supply of the first vaccine approved by the TGA. St Louis Estate residents fall into the Phase 1b rollout and we will update you as soon as we receive more information about the rollout dates.

We continue to remain confident in our emergency response procedures and hope we won't have to experience any further lockdowns.

As we move in to March be sure to check out our upcoming events and RSVP your attendance to the Whiteman Park Bus Trip and our Easter Morning Tea Celebration on 1st April.

We know life at St Louis is made extra special by our wonderful residents and community whom regularly come together to share meals, participate in activities and enjoy social events. - the different types of aged care services available
- your eligibility for services
- referrals to service providers that can meet your needs
- your contribution to the cost of your aged care.

It's never too early to talk about getting some extra help. Knowing what services are available before you need them will help you be prepared to make decisions about your future.

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE?

Care at home

My Aged Care can help you access services at home which can improve your wellbeing and help you stay independent. Receiving help with regular activities at the right time can help you manage better at home.

You may be eligible to receive services such as:

- · personal care like help with getting dressed
- transport
- modifications to your home like hand rails or ramps
- nursing, physiotherapy and other care

- meals
- household jobs like cleaning or gardening
- equipment like walking frames
- social activities

Short-term help

My Aged Care can also help you access shortterm care services for situations such as:

- recovery from an illness, including after a hospital stay
- when you have had a setback and want to get your independence back
- when you or your carer needs a break (respite care).

Care in an aged care home

If you find you need ongoing help with day- today tasks or health care, a residential aged care home lets you live in a supported environment where help is available 24 hours a day.



Who pays for services?

The Australian Government contributes to the cost of aged care services. You are expected to contribute to the cost if you can afford to. How much you pay may depend on:

- your financial situation
- the number and types of services you receive
- the service provider

Are you eligible for services?

A call to My Aged Care can help you understand:

- what services may be available
- how much they cost
- how you can access them.

My Aged Care may arrange a face-to-face assessment of your care needs.

HOW TO ACCESS SERVICES

1

Call My Aged Care on 1800 200 422* or apply for an assessment online

You will be asked questions over the phone to help work out your needs and care arrangements – this takes at least ten minutes.

- You can also apply for an assessment on the My Aged Care website.
- You will need your Medicare card.
- If you're applying for someone else, they will need to give their consent.



Have a face-to-face assessment

- You can also apply for an assessment on the My Aged Care who may arrange for a trained assessor to come to your home.
- With your consent they will assess your care needs and eligibility for services. They will then work with you to develop a support plan which addresses your needs, goals and preferences.
- Someone else can be with you during this visit.



Find out about costs

 My Aged Care and service providers can give you information about how much you might have to pay. You may need to complete a financial assessment through the Department of Human Services.



Find a provider

- The My Aged Care website can help you find and compare providers in your area.
- Your assessor and My Aged Care can also help you find a provider(s) in your local area that meets your needs.
