



BETWEEN THE WARS

Bill Edgar, researcher and archivist, gave us a fascinating talk about the period between the Great Wars 1 and 2.



The 30 year period saw the rise of narcistic leaders in Hitler, Mussolini, Stalin who led totalitarian regimes. Japan also belonged in this anti democracy group and Bill's account of Japan's effort to extend their empire to Australia was most compelling.

Japan came very close and would have achieved its goal but for the U.S. joining the war after Pearl Harbour and the crucial sea battles of the Coral Sea and Milne Bay. On our doorstep, In New Guinea, on the Kokoda Trail under ten thousand Australian troops held off twenty five thousand Japanese to stem the land advance South within sight of Port Moresby. What heroes we had fighting in the jungles of

Former Malaysian Airlines pilot, Edgar Evans gave us an absorbing insight into his research on the mystery of the disappearance of Boeing 777 MH 370

His conclusion:

"It was a suicide mission. Captain Zaharie Ahmad Shah piloted the doomed Boeing 777 into the swell in the remote southern reaches of the Indian Ocean- the last action of his meticulously planned and executed disappearing act."

New Guinea, where the biggest killer by the factor of four was Malaria and typhus!

Bill 's book on the subject Warrior of Kokoda, is the story of Brigadier Arnold Potts, a farmer from Kojonup, commander of the Australians, who became a controversial figure.
