

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The AGM for 2023 was held in Kingsmill lounge on 22nd November. Ed Wilson and Sarah Williamson presented their reports for the year. References were made to the comprehensive written report sent to all residents. It showed that the year had its challenges but the Estate has come through financially in a good state. Just a few of the many highlights spoken of by Ed and Sarah are worth mentioning.

- *In the past year 30 units have turned over. Much higher than past years
- *11 Of the 16 apartments are now occupied at Kiora
- *Residents Levy has only increased by 5% in past 5 years (1% a year)
- *Catering revenue down on budget but picking up of late
- Rental unit proving popular and well booked
- Staff costs up Repairs and maintenance cost under budget
- *Insurance (Buildings) 20% higher to \$94000
- Sinking fund contributions are only made from the sale of units
