

A BLAST FROM THE PAST

The history of St Louis Estate 1986-2006

The following archival documents clarify the ownership of St Louis from the beginning in 1986.

Clough Engineering began building the estate in 1986 and in a guick turnover Alan Bond became the owner in 1987. But it does not appear to have been in his hands for long as the next owner Landrow Developments are listed as owners in 1988 and held it, in a partnership with the Prindiville family, for the next 18 years. The current owners CHC and the Peploe family took over in 2006.

The Bond takeover date is unclear but it is worth noting that 1987 was the year of his defence of the America's Cup and when he paid \$1 BILLION for Channel 9. He would certainly have been looking for some hard cash at the time!

St Louis residents welcome new villas

The long-awaited completion of a group of huxury villas at St Louis Estate in Claremont is being celebrated by residents.

All 24 villas were sold long before the completion date, which was a year longer than anticipated due to the WA building box

longer than anticipated due to the WA building boom.

The first residents moved in during July and the last eight villas were ready for the removal vans to arrive this week.

The villas were built in three stages on sloping land in Dean Street, with northern exposure to big courtyards on the ground level and balconies on the second.

the second.

The belconies have been glassed in to create a sunny extension to the living areas and all the villas have two bedrooms and two bathrooms.

The standard of finish includes granite benchtops, high ceilings and dutcled reverse-cycle air-conditioning, with plenty of storage and good-quality floor and window treatments.

The kitchen has a dishwasher and microwave oven as well as a choice of gas or electric cooktops. In the

laundry, located in the second

inundry, socated in the second bathroom, a washing machine and wall-mounted dryer are provided.

The villas sold from \$465,000 to \$600,000 and have secure parking in an underground garage with remote-controlled gates and private storenome.

Monthly levies for the villas are

Monthly levies for the villas are \$348, which covers outside maintenance, gardening, administration and use of facilities in the village's Homestead clubhouse. Sales agent Peter Hunt said the villas had attracted a slightly younger clientele to the village, with an average age in the low 70s. A few clients were from other States but most were locals who formerly lived within 10km of the village. A feature of the villas is their presentation to the street, with driveways to underground garages. Decorative limestone and

Decorative limestone and

Decorative limestone and Kimberley stone feature walls also distinguish the villas, which have rendered walls and tile roofs. Landscaping with water features, gently sloping paths and limestone retaining walls link the new villas with the rest of the village. The

landscaping was designed by Tim Davies Landscaping. A new gardening group at the village has involved residents in the care and development of the extensive gardens around the site. Every unit in the village of 127 homes has been sold and there is a

homes has been sold and there is a waiting list for the older refurbished

villas.
Continuing Health Care took over the management of St Louis Estate this month after 18 years with the Landrow Board.
Continuing Health Care has managed aged-care facilities in WA for 30 years and has three other villages — in Lathlain, Mandurah and Nedlands.
The transference

Nedlands.
The transfer of ownership coincides with the completion of the Dean Street villas. Construction of a care facility alongside the new villas will start later this year and provide additional services within the village.

We have recorded the history of St Louis up to 1986 in previous newsletters.

It was difficult to trace the exact ownership for the 1986 to 2006 period but it has been solved by the finding of the piece above. So we can conclude that when the schools were sold in 1986 Clough became owners with Bond in a joint partnership. Landrow took over in 1990 with Prindiville Investment as a shareholder. Then we have the current owners taking over in 2006.

The early British settlers arrived with high expectations of a lush and fertile, well-watered land and were taken by surprise at the hardships: soil, described by writer Anthony Trollope as 'suitable for hour glasses', transport difficulties ('the river or else'), primitive roads and houses; lack of labour (until the convicts); the isolation, the alien bush and mysterious indigenous inhabitants.

However, under the direction of Managing Director Horrie Miller and the Chief Engineer, they managed to restore the plane, including installing a new engine.

After 34 days the aircraft was successfully repaired and the passengers were rescued.
