Laurie Varendorff | 7th March

Numerous Ways Not To Die: Adventures of a True Blue Aussie

Laurie has worked 52 jobs, visited 49 countries, and cheated death more than once! In 2023, he began compiling memoirs for friends and family, sharing people, places, pictures, and his knack for getting into scrapes—especially in his younger years.

Born in Brisbane in 1940, Laurie proudly calls himself a "true-blue Aussie." His travels began in 1952 with the Young Australia League, journeying from Hervey Bay to Sydney.

He later lived in Barcelona, then London, before crossing the Atlantic to New York and San Francisco, with a quick stop in Mexico. In July 1966, he married LaVone in California, and they spent three years in Vancouver before settling in Perth in 1970 with their first child.

Christine Harris | 14th March

People of Western Australian Ghost Towns

In a state that is larger than many countries around the world, you could expect to find some extraordinary stories. Christine Harris is a researcher who will be telling us fascinating stories coming from the past — stories of hardship, courage, extreme wealth and extreme poverty. Sometimes the earth is all that is left to mark the passing of the communities that has made up the history of our state. At present, the list of identified ghost towns sits at around 700. Of these, the mining towns are the best known; Day Dawn, Kanowna, Mount Morgan and Nannine.

Soils for Life

Shortly after he retired from being Governor General, Michael Jeffery established his NGO Soils for Life. He set up this organisation because he was very concerned about the visible degradation of the Australian landscape: the diminishing water and healthy soil availability for agricultural use. Despite good practices of many land managers and farmers, the reality of a degraded landscape with severe salinity, erosion, diminishing river flows, high evaporation, declining soil health and rising input costs, the need for change was very evident. I was fortunate to be involved with the Soils for Life for more than five years. Michael bravely took me on as his speech writer and researcher. My time there was a steep learning curve but I loved it, especially working with committed scientists, farmers, ecologists and land mangers in a cause that I still believe to be so important.

CHARLIE TOWNSEND - COLD WAR MARINE



Charlie's story is one of patriotism and adventure, beginning with his decision to join the U.S. Marine Corps, where he became a Second Lieutenant. He vividly explained the precision required for an aircraft to land on a carrier, using an on-deck mirror as a guide. If a plane missed the deck cables, it had to maintain full speed to regain elevation—failure to do so could result in a crash or a plunge into the sea.

He described the tense moments when planes had to make another approach, sometimes in total darkness, and the risks posed by an improperly parked aircraft on deck. His thrilling accounts of performing loop-the-loops was a highlight of his time in the Marine Corps. However, his call to service meant putting his university studies on hold, A sacrifice he accepted in pursuit of duty.

Born in a SS occupied Belgian village in 1941, Antoine Bloeman's journey spans continents and careers. He shares his memories from wartime Belgium to his arrival in Perth in 1972, where he attended UWA and earned his law degree.

After starting his career as a sole practitioner in Mandurah and Perth, he went on to serve as a magistrate in the Pilbara and Kimberley from 1995 to 2008. His fascinating story included travels as a merchant seaman, service in the US armed forces, and his distinguished career as a renowned magistrate in Broome.

SIR WILLIAM HESELTINE "DOYEN" OF ST LOUIS RESIDENTS

Bill Heseltine has been a significant contributor to Village life as a resident for 19 years. He has been attending and supporting St Louis functions and events with wife, Diana, over the past eight years.

This article from the Post appeared in 2011 and it summarises his extraordinary career and life before his retirement in 1990. He shares with George and Gladys Powell the title of longest term residents at St Louis Estate.

FROM PERTH TO THE PALACE

When he first moved to St Louis Estate in 2006, Sir William Heseltine was one of three knights – along with Sir Charles Court and Sir James Cruthers. He amusingly coined a name for his home – The Good Knight's Rest!

Perth-born, and a former student of Christ Church Grammar School and UWA, Sir William is 'back home' after a stellar career, which culminated in being appointed as the Private Secretary to Her Majesty the Queen from 1986 until his retirement in 1990.

His route to England was via Canberra, where, after four years as Private Secretary to Prime Minister Sir Robert Menzies in the 1950s, he was seconded to Buckingham Palace as Assistant Press Secretary before a spell back in Australia. In 1965, he returned to the Royal Household, this time as Press Secretary, later transferring to the Private Secretary's office.

His family have lived in Royal residences and Sir William stays in touch with the Queen. He hopes to say 'hello', again, when Her Majesty visits WA for the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting later this month.

"I felt I got to know her very well; after all, I saw her almost every working day for a good number of years," he commented. One of Sir William's many career highlights has been receiving the Order of Australia in 1988 from the Queen, at Government House in Perth, during her tour for Australia's Bicentenary.

Another memorable year was 1977 – the Queen's Silver Jubilee – when she visited every county in England and Wales, all the Scottish region and part of Northern Ireland. Sir William said, "She has the remarkable capacity to pace herself. While the rest of us were exhausted, we felt she could have done it all over again."

Sir William and his wife now spend their time between Perth and York, and he has recounted his extraordinary life in a memoir for his family.

Enjoying the St Louis lifestyle, he attends morning teas when possible, and looks forward to his weekly games of bridge over lunch. He is enormously proud of his 17-year old grandson, Angus, who recently became the under-19 English Bridge Pairs Champion.
