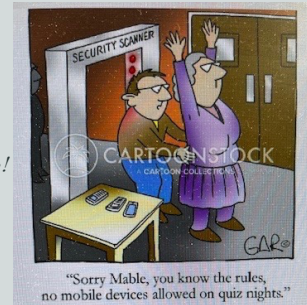

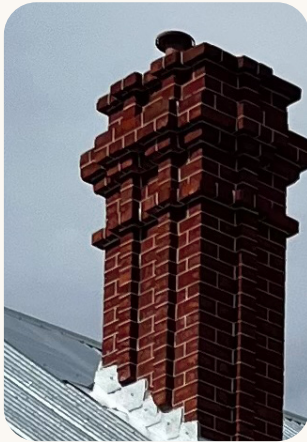

Pic 3: Even the chimneys received a professional restoration. Perfect tuckpointing bringing back the original features.



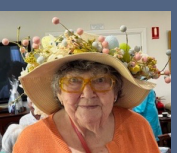
Pic 4: The combined features of limestone and brick give these ancient walls a special look.

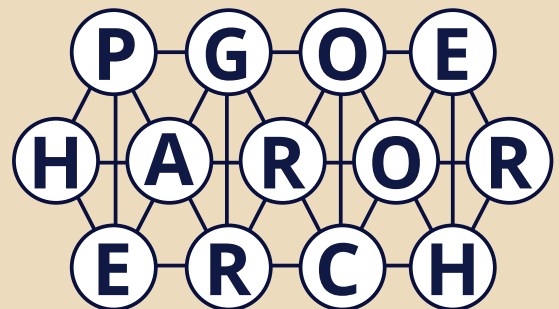
