## David Taylor and John Garland | 5th September Pianist/Vocalist

John Garland (vocals) and David Taylor (piano) present, A Walk Down Memory Lane in Song. The two have created a set of selected pieces for voice and piano that embrace some memorable songs over the past decade.

John Garland, AM, is best known for his work in Executive Lifestyle Properties, service to Rotary over the past 34 years including past President of Rotary Club of Perth, officiating as auctioneer at over 3,000 auctions, past President of the Real Estate Institute of Western Australia (REIWA), and past Chair of The Small Business Development Corporation. In 2007 John was awarded an order of Australia (AM) in recognition of his services to real estate and the community.

Perhaps less known is his passion for music and singing in a male voice choir as a Bass 2, or B2 as it's called. In terms of vocal range, B2 is a very low note and falls within the lower end of the range for a baritone or the absolute bottom of the range for a tenor. Similarities can be drawn to Paul Robeson who was famous for his beautiful deep singing voice, notably Ol' Man River, which John also performs.

David Taylor is a pianist, composer and songwriter. He is a mature age student, studying a Bachelor of Music at the University Of Western Australia Conservatorium Of Music. Originally studying classical music he has moved towards developing his own style of what he calls, "nostalgic classics with a soupçon of improvisation". He enjoys playing standards such as Autumn Leaves, As Time Goes By, Over the Rainbow, On a Street Where You Live and the like.

He also enjoys playing pieces from movies and theatre such as Phantom of the Opera, Titanic, Les Mis, Forrest Gump and others.

David has a relaxed style and enjoys it when people around him are in a comfortable setting, enjoying the company of others while he adds to the ambiance.





### A VISIT FROM THE GOLDEN DAYS OF TV

It was a walk down memory lane like no other when the residents we're treated to a captivating guest speaker Sandy Baker, a name familiar to many who grew up in WA in the early days of television. With a voice as warm as ever and a sparkle in her eye Sandy took us back in time to a time when families gathered around small black and white television sets and adjusted the antenna, hoping for a clear picture.

Sandy was the beloved presenter of a major children's programme on channel 7 in the early 1970s that became a daily ritual for thousands of children across the state. With joy and humour she recalled the magic of introducing characters like Percy the Penguin and of course the unforgettable Fat Cat a gentle furry figure who became a household name and was always tucked into bed right before the nightly sign off. She spoke fondly of the studio lights the live broadcasts where anything could, and often did, happen. Residents chuckled as Sandy described how in those early days even the most minor costume mishap or forgotten line would be broadcast live. There was no such thing as retakes or cue cards.

Her stories stirred up memories for many in the audience - grandparents who had watched alongside their children and even some who remembered the early TV sets and the excitement of the introduction of color TV in 1975s. It was a delightful morning of nostalgia.
